ORDINANCE 2020-1

**An Ordinance to amend Section 30-2 (c) of the Town of Campbell Code of Ordinances related to
boulevard, right-of-way restrictions**

SECTION I: Section 30-2 is hereby amended and reads as follows:

Sec. 30-2. Boulevards and rights-of-way.

- (a) *Definitions.* The term “boulevard” means all land in public street or highway rights-of-way lying between the lot lines and the curblines (if curb and gutter exist), or all lands lying between the lot lines and the paved portions of the public streets or highways if curb and gutter do not exist.
- (b) *Responsibility to maintain.* Every owner of land within the town whose land abuts a boulevard or right-of-way is required to maintain or have maintained by his tenant, the boulevard or right-of-way directly abutting such land. Every owner shall keep mailboxes located on the boulevard or right-of-way free and clear of snow.
- (c) *Boulevard, right-of-way restrictions.* No person shall place any accessory structure or use, including landscaping ornaments, stones, basketball backboards/hoops, lawn sprinkler systems, fences or garbage can racks on town boulevards or right-of-ways.

From November 1st to April 1st residents may at their own liability place small fiberglass poles/posts no more than ¼ inch in diameter by a maximum of 48” in height near the edge of the road to delineate the road’s edge for snowplowing purposes. These stakes shall be placed at least 18” back from the edge of the pavement. Residents must obtain a permit prior to placing stakes in the Town right-of-way.

The town assumes no responsibility for damages or claims of damage to the poles or damage caused as a result of the poles being placed along the edge of the road. The posts may be placed at a distance of 6’ to 12’ apart.

Posts put in place before November 1st and left up after April 1st (excluding a snow emergency) shall be removed from the right-of-way and, if unclaimed, will be disposed of after 7 days by maintenance personnel. This provision expressly prohibits the placement of any posts or materials as described above on any county highway right-of-way.

SECTION II. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by Section 60.80 of the Wisconsin State Statutes.
